## 19<sup>th</sup> July 2020 : Sixteenth Sunday of the Year

*On Wednesday we celebrate the feast of Saint Mary Magdalene, the first recorded witness to the Resurrection, and a wonderful example of a reformed sinner. Known as the 'apostle to the apostles' for bringing the news of Christ's resurrection to Peter and the others, she is an inspiring saint whose intercession we might ask for:*

When Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and did not find the Lord's body, she thought it had been taken away and so informed the disciples. After they came and saw the tomb, they too believed what Mary had told them. The text then says: *The disciples went back home, and it adds: but Mary wept and remained standing outside the tomb.* We should reflect on Mary's attitude and the great love she felt for Christ; for though the disciples had left the tomb, she remained. She was still seeking the one she had not found, and while she sought she wept; burning with the fire of love, she longed for him who she thought had been taken away. And so it happened that the woman who stayed behind to seek Christ was the only one to see



him. For perseverance is essential to any good deed, as the voice of truth tells us: *Whoever perseveres to the end will be saved.*

At first she sought but did not find, but when she persevered it happened that she found what she was looking for. When our desires are not satisfied, they grow stronger, and becoming stronger they take hold of their object. Holy desires likewise grow with anticipation, and if they do not grow they are not really desires. Anyone who succeeds in attaining the truth has

burned with such a great love. As David says: *My soul has thirsted for the living God; when shall I come and appear before the face of God?* And also in the Song of Songs the Church says: *I was wounded by love;* and again: *My soul is melted with love.*

*Woman, why are you weeping? Whom do you seek?* She is asked why she is sorrowing so that her desire might be strengthened; for when she mentions whom she is seeking, her love is kindled all the more ardently. *Jesus says to her: Mary.* Jesus is not recognised when he calls her “woman”; so he calls her by name, as though he were saying: Recognise me as I recognise you; for I do not know you as I know others; I know you as yourself. And so Mary, once addressed by name, recognises who is speaking. She immediately calls him *rabboni*, that is to say, *teacher*, because the one whom she sought outwardly was the one who inwardly taught her to keep on searching. (Saint Gregory the Great)

## Access to a Priest or the Sacraments

Although our two churches remain closed at the present time Mass is still celebrated every day for the intentions of all the parishioners of Southwell and Calverton, and for the specific intentions you have requested. If you need to contact Father Simon, please get in touch.

**Funeral Services** can still be held, at the cemetery or crematorium, and a Requiem Mass or Memorial Mass can be celebrated later, when it’s possible to gather again in church. If you or someone you know wishes to be anointed with the **Sacrament of the Sick** please speak with Father Simon. Likewise, if you or someone you know wishes to celebrate the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** (Confession) this can be arranged directly with Father Simon.

## A Spiritual Communion

Spiritual Communion is the heartfelt desire to receive Our Lord, even when we are unable because of the distance or for some other reason, such as in the present circumstances. If you are live-streaming the Mass, or praying the texts of the Mass, when it comes to the time for receiving Holy Communion pray instead the prayer:

**From Saint Alphonsus Liguori:** My Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as being already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

## Reopening of Catholic churches in England – Update 17<sup>th</sup> July

Over the last few weeks the Government has relaxed the regulations surrounding places of worship, and now our churches are able to open for private prayer and for Mass too. Our churches in Southwell and Calverton, being part of the Diocese of Nottingham, are subject to the decisions of Bishop Patrick, who has issued regulations concerning how we might reopen our churches.

Sincere thanks to those who have offered to help as volunteers, and who have emailed Father Simon with suggestions, advice, and offers of help over the past few weeks. Father Simon hopes to meet this week with those parishioners who have offered to help, and will be in contact with each one. The current situation is:

- ✘ the protocols we have to follow are relevant to every Catholic church in England, and so although they might seem onerous we have no option to not follow them, although there is no pressure to reopen our churches in Southwell and Calverton until we are ready to do so;
- ✘ although we are one parish we have two churches with little cross-over in their similarly-sized congregations; therefore it would be good to be able to reopen both churches at the same time;
- ✘ the Sunday obligation continues to be suspended and so there's no requirement for Masses to be celebrated on Sunday, if celebrations on other days might be more feasible; indeed, in our parish setting we might consider one Mass in each church each week;
- ✘ once the public celebration of Masses have been resumed it would be advantageous to continue celebrating each week; therefore offers of help, rotas, etc, have to be sustainable over the medium term;
- ✘ there is still some doubt about whether those over 70 years old can volunteer as stewards; alternatively there are other jobs to be done which could be undertaken from home, or by those who are shielding;
- ✘ all stewards, cleaners, and those working in church would have to be registered volunteers with the diocese; anyone helping from home wouldn't have to be;
- ✘ we would need a minimum of four volunteers per Mass, and the duties would last perhaps two hours (including the cleaning beforehand and afterwards);
- ✘ realigning pews and chairs to observe the two-metre social distancing, and a one-way system, we might be able to accommodate 20 people in either church.

**We might aim to open both of our churches for Mass  
from the Solemnity of the Assumption, 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> August**

**The Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes** in France, has for more than 160 years been an essential place for millions of people who visit each year, seeking hope, healing, fraternity and deepened faith. Navigating the top of the homepage at [www.lourdes-france.org/en/](http://www.lourdes-france.org/en/) it is also possible to request a Mass, light a candle and place a prayer petition in the grotto.

**The Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land** oversees 55 sanctuaries in Israel, the Palestinian territories and Jordan. Visitors at [www.custodia.org/en/sanctuaries](http://www.custodia.org/en/sanctuaries) can

get a more in-depth look at these sacred places, especially the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem and the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, revered as the site of Jesus's tomb, in Jerusalem.

**The Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima** in Portugal offers a livestream of the chapel and live daily broadcasts of praying the rosary and Mass at [www.fatima.pt/en/pages/online-transmissions](http://www.fatima.pt/en/pages/online-transmissions). The same link also provides a gallery of pictures, videos and "sounds," including an audio library of Marian hymns. Though only in Italian, the **Holy House of Loreto** near the Adriatic Sea in Italy posts videos of their daily Masses and the recitation of the rosary on their YouTube channel "Santa Casa Loreto" at [www.youtube.com/channel/UCT9uLSAfEqgXbArvYyHzQg](https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCT9uLSAfEqgXbArvYyHzQg). Their main website at [santuarioloreto.it/](http://santuarioloreto.it/) has links for sending prayer intentions and for photos and videos of the sanctuary, which tradition holds is where Mary was born and raised and where the Holy Family was thought to have lived when Jesus was a boy. The one-room Holy House also is held to be the place where Mary received the angel's annunciation and conceived the Son of God through the Holy Spirit.

## The Year of the Word Radio Service

2020 is the 'Year of the Word' in the Catholic Church in England and Wales – to celebrate, share and live out faith through deeper Scriptural engagement. However the Bishops have decided that the 'God Who Speaks' Scripture initiative is extended through 2021 to take into account the cancellation of many non-digital events planned for this year.

On Sunday, BBC Radio 4's Sunday Worship programme comes from Yorkshire and focuses on a special Bible-focused service "A Word for All Seasons". Dioceses across our two countries have engaged in different projects as part of this initiative and Sunday Worship, scheduled for 8:10am, comes from the Diocese of Leeds where priests and parishioners have been exploring the 'Word Unlocked'. Father Michael Hall will lead 'A Word for All Seasons' to reflect on how the 'God who Speaks' meets us in the changing circumstances of our lives – especially significant at a time when many Christians will have been turning to the Bible for comfort through the coronavirus pandemic. Father Michael is parish priest of two churches, Saint Joseph and St Patrick in Brighouse and Elland respectively.

The service will include Scripture passages that have particular emphasis on the importance of the Word of God and hymns and motets previously recorded in Leeds Cathedral by the Leeds Diocesan Choirs. The homily will be given by the Diocese of Leeds' newest priest, Father Henry Longbottom who will be ordained in Leeds Cathedral just two days before the Sunday Worship Programme.
